# COUNSELORS IN TRAINING (CIT)

For teens entering grades 7 through 9

### HOURS: Monday - Friday, 8:45 am - 4:30 pm, from 6/29 - 9/4

- An inclusive environment where teens can grow in their artistic practice and leadership skills
- Leadership training consisting of team-building, communication and self reflection activities
- Fun, elevated and inspiring art projects in a CIT-only art class
- Opportunities to assist younger campers in the Vacation Arts Camp
- Art Show each Friday, 4:00 pm, at the camp-wide Show & Share

### Who is a CIT?

At ACA, Counselors in Training are the oldest group of campers, who want to build leadership skills, engage with younger kids and take part in challenging, inspiring art classes.

What do CITs do every day? CITs receive leadership training each morning in the form of fun, creative communication and team building games. They also complete a visual or written self-reflection activity before heading to the classrooms to assist the teachers and act as role models for the younger campers. CITs have snack, lunch and recess to enjoy some relaxation and some outdoor time. In the afternoons, CITs have their own theme-based art class that features challenging and fun multi-media projects.

### What's special about this program?

The CIT program fosters a uniquely creative, inclusive and welcoming atmosphere for young teens, while preparing them to consider their future involvement in the arts.

#### Are CITs hired for counselor positions?

CITs are eligible to apply to work as Assistant Counselors and Arts Camp Counselors. Please see requirements for those positions on page 14.
Being a CIT does not guarantee
employment, and many CITs prefer to
stay in the CIT program, as it entails
less responsibility and includes more creative art opportunities.



### Week 1: 6/29 - 7/2 (4 Day Week) Digital Photography\*



### **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

#### Where is camp located?

Weeks 1-7 of camp are located at **Gibbs School**, **41 Foster Street**, **Arlington**. We are excited to host camp in brand new classrooms, an innovative theater and a comfortable air conditioned environment.

Weeks 8 - 10 will take place at **St Paul's Church, 929 Concord Turnpike, Arlington**. St. Paul's has been host to ACA's February, April and Summer Camps in the past. We thank the St Paul's community for having us back!

Art Academy and Weeks 8 - 10 of Teen Studio will take place at **ACA**, 20 Academy St, Arlington.

#### What is needed for registration?

Please visit the Arts Camp page on our website, acarts.org, where you will find our Emergency Contact and Medical Forms and Allergy Action Plan (if needed). In addition, we require a copy of your child's most recent immunization record. These forms are due no later than two weeks prior to the start of the program.

#### What should I bring?

For all our programs, please send your child in clothes that you don't mind getting a bit messy. No flip-flops, please! For half day programs, please send a nut-free snack and a waterbottle. For full day camps, send your camper with a nut-free snack and lunch, and a water bottle labeled with your child's name. For extended day, please send an extra nut-free snack. Your child may enjoy having a book during Extended Day. Please leave valuables at home. Cell phones and other electronics may not be used during camp hours.

## Will my child be with other kids of the same age? Can I make a special friend request?

Campers will spend each week in small groups of approximately 15 kids, which are great venues to meet new friends. Groups are decided based upon each camper's birthday. Each group enjoys activities that are specifically designed to be age appropriate. Please submit all friend requests when you register and we will do our best to honor these requests. We cannot accommodate friend requests or group requests made on the first day of camp.

### Do the kids get outdoors and have any physical activity during the day?

All our campers enjoy plenty of time outdoors – it's summer after all! After the first activity, we all meet outside for Snack and Outdoor Fun & Games, led by our Camp Coordinators. We'll limbo, freeze dance, play tag, run obstacle courses and other camp favorites. After lunch, we have more Outdoor Fun & Games, that offers unstructured play as well as games and activities! Additionally, our campers are constantly on the move as they dance, sing and act!

### My child loves art, but is afraid of drama – what can we do?

Our camp program integrates all of the arts – visual arts, music and drama, but no child is ever forced to participate in activities that feel uncomfortable. Kids who do not want to get on stage can help with props or costumes, or find another way to take part in our drama activities. Most often, though, our shy or reluctant campers enjoy our drama games so much they that forget their fears and enjoy the experience.

### How will I know what my child is doing in camp each week?

You will receive a Confirmation Letter and Welcome Letter prior to the start of the week. During Vacation Arts Camp, we present a Camp Show & Share every Friday! Campers display their art projects and each group performs a short song or skit on stage. It's a fun opportunity to see camp in action!

### **ASSISTANT COUNSELORS**

The Assistant Counselor program offers an opportunity for teens to get the training and experience to work as counselors at ACA and to grow in confidence, empowerment and enthusiasm. With the guidance of ACA staff, they build leadership and communication skills, gain professional experience and learn to maintain camp values and best practices as they work with campers.

### **FAQ**

### What is the difference between Counselors in Training and Assistant Counselors?

Assistant Counselors are part of the ACA summer staff, and we expect the same level of responsibility, reliability and professionalism that we see in the rest of our employees. The program prioritizes professional training. CITs are the oldest group of campers, and their program emphasizes social experiences and artmaking.

### Will Assistant Counselors be hired as Camp Counselors for future programs?

Assistant Counselors who have demonstrated the necessary skills may apply to work as Camp Counselors in the future. It is our hope that Assistant Counselors will be confident and fully prepared to step into the role of Counselor.

### What does the schedule look like for Assistant Counselors?

Assistant Counselors are hired on a weekly basis; they work Monday – Friday, 8:45 am – 4:30 pm. Each morning, they check in with the Leadership Coordinator before reporting to their daily assignment. Assistant Counselors take breaks during snack and lunch, and meet with the Leadership Coordinator for a training session during each afternoon.

### What are the benefits to working as an Assistant Counselor?

A limited number of Assistant Counselors each week means individualized

instruction and lots of support and guidance. Assistant Counselors receive a weekly stipend. The program also prepares teens for continued work in the arts and child development at ACA and elsewhere.

#### Requirements and how to apply:

We are seeking teens, grade 9 and up, who love the arts, enjoy working with kids, and will benefit from professional training. If that sounds good to you, download the application at acarts.org and return it to us as soon as possible. Assistant Counselors need not have been campers or CITs previously.

#### **Arts Camp Counselors:**

ACA is seeking mature, responsible and reliable applicants who like working with kids, have an outgoing personality, and enjoy the visual arts, music and drama.

Counselors lead a group of approximately 15 children in groups divided according to age. Counselors reinforce all safety precautions, model appropriate behavior, aid teachers in carrying out lesson plans and supervise children during snack, lunch, and during all activities. Counselors must be 16 years or older, responsible, active and enthusiastic!
